At a Glance

Class Band	3rd – 5th Class
Scope Alignment	Minimum six non-toxic water colours with one brush in a printed box.
Teacher Note	Show the right amount of water first.

What the Kit Provides

- Minimum six assorted colour cakes or tubes
- One brush in a durable printed box
- Bright, non-toxic, easily soluble colours
- Clearly labelled, closable container



Learning Objective

Develop creative expression, colour recognition and controlled brush movement.



Suggested Duration
25 – 40 minutes



Materials to Use With

Activity Wear (Item 2), drawing sheet, water cup and cloth.

Step-by-Step Teacher Guide

Simple Steps, Big Learning!

1



Wet the brush

Dip, then wipe extra water on the cup's rim.

2



Pick up colour

Rub the wet brush gently on a colour cake.

3



Practise strokes

Paint thin lines, thick lines, dots and waves.

4



Mix a colour

Red + yellow = orange; blue + yellow = green.

5



Paint a picture

Large light areas first, small details last.

6



Rinse and pack

Rinse the brush; dry the box open, then close.

Teacher Prompts

- What happens when you add water?
- Which two colours make green?
- Where will you paint first?
- How did you stop colours running?

Expected Learning Outcomes

- Creative expression and colour recognition develop.
- Children explore shades, tones and colour mixing.
- Fine-motor control, wrist stability and focus improve.

Quick Assessment

- Uses the right amount of water.
- Mixes two colours to make a new one.
- Cleans the brush and packs the set.

Safety and Care

- Never put the brush or colours in the mouth.
- Don't leave the brush standing in water.
- Wash hands after painting.
